Apart from his academic engagements, Mr. Capidos also served various functions, i.e., president of the student organization Katechetika International; student worker at the Ukrainian Refugee Center in Louvain; representative of the Advisory Committee for International Students; and a member of KU Leuven's Center for Liberation Theologies.

On August 30, 2021, Dr. Aoanan was a recipient of the Centennial Diakonia Award from his Alma Mater, Silliman University Divinity School.
